The transfer of health care from Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services to Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care in Ontario;

Advancing the continuity of care between correctional facilities and the community;

Raising the standards of care in correctional facilities to meet or exceed community and professional standards of care;

Raising standards of care in correctional facilities to achieve immediate health remedies.

The above will be achieved through:

Analysis of policies, reports, submissions, and data;

Creation and submission of media content, including op-eds;

Creation and submission of letters and/or reports to appropriate government bodies;

Coalition-building, reaching out to new stakeholders
